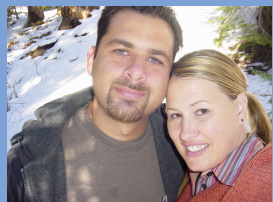

I was on the campus for just a day, to gain a little experience while at a new staff training conference in Aliso Viejo. The campus was Cal State Dominguez Hills in the Los Angeles area. My job was to find out as much as I could about the campus. Campus Crusade was interested in starting a new ministry there. As I walked about the campus, I had some time to share with college students. The thing about sharing your faith is that you never know when God is going to give you a divine appointment with someone. But here I was on the campus and God had a student in mind for me to talk to. I first saw him from a distance, I saw that he was sitting alone and seemed available to talk. I went to go ask him if he would be interested in giving his opinion on a questionnaire. Questionnaires are what we use to find out a student's spiritual background so we can know where they are coming from. As we talked, it was clear that this student, Juan, was from a Catholic background but that he understood little about the Gospel.

Juan was immediately interested in hearing about Christ. As I shared with him from the Four Laws, Campus Crusade's tract about the Gospel, he seemed to track well with what we were telling him and as I asked him questions, he seemed to understand the message as we were communicating it to him. Then came the crucial moment. I had shared with Juan the basics of the Gospel and he had understood it. But now I told him that it was crucial to receive Jesus as his savior and lord. I asked him if that was something he wanted to do and he said "Yes."
